

The Beefmaster Breed Tilts the Scales for Ranchers

"The Modesto Bee," a California publication ran the following article in their January 12, 1985 issue. Excerpts are reprinted with permission of reporter Stephen Ferris who covered the California Cattlemen's Association meeting.

Jerry Maltby is a man who knows a lot about the production of beef. He manages the Bovine Test Center near the farming community of Oakdale, in the San Joaquin Valley, about 100 miles east of San Francisco. Recently, Maltby was one of the speakers at a California Cattlemen's Association meeting.

In essence, Maltby spoke to one subject. "The nation's cattlemen have to become more efficient beef producers if they are going to continue in business." Many agricul-

tural economists throughout the country are painting a dim picture for livestock over the next several months. Principally because cattlemen are having to wrestle with high interest rates and a lowering demand for red meat. As a result, continued Maltby, "We have a number of ranchers who will probably not survive 1985." These feelings were also echoed by Leo Johnson, Assistant Manager of the California Cattlemen's Association.

Historically, the cattle industry has never returned the same margin of profit as have other industries.

Maltby believes those cattlemen who do make it during the coming months will be the better producers. He also believes one of the tools many of these better producers will use is Beefmaster cattle.

Maltby said the breed represents a tool that until a few years ago was not used to full advantage in California. Now, however, he feels the breed is becoming much more popular with cattlemen because it will produce more efficient, heavier animals at weaning weight.

Maltby emphasized the importance of this latter fact to those cattlemen in attendance. He said "The principle is fairly simple, if you can increase the animal's weaning weight it means a higher return to you (the cattle producer) in terms of dollars at sale time."

Maltby continued, "We have a situation now where feedlot operators are paying two to four cents a pound more if the cattle they buy show a little Brahman influence." This of course is true of the Beefmaster animal.

Maltby continued, "The extra weight you will get with these cattle can make the difference in making or losing money."

"The Beefmaster animals perform very well for us, they have always been at the top of our weight gain tests," he said. "The Beefmaster is a very fertile animal with a good sexual maturity. You can turn out heifers at a young age and they will conceive."

Maltby stated the Beefmaster animal had a number of advantages . . . "They can handle colder climates and can survive well where the purebred Brahman has problems. Beefmasters have done well in northern California, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming and Canada but the reason they are such a hit is simply that the guys are making more money with them."

It is Maltby's feeling that this same Brahman influence also brings to the Beefmaster a high degree of disease resistance.

The Bovine Test Center in Oakdale has tested more Beefmasters than anyone else in California. Most of the animals have come from California although Maltby said the Center had tested Beefmasters from a number of other areas as well. The Center's bull testing division takes in cattle for 140 days to run gain tests on them. The

owners are then sent computerized reports stating the results of those tests. In addition to testing, the Center also carries on an embryo transplant program.

Stanislaus County Farm Advisor, Bill van Riet, informed the group that the Beefmaster breed was developed by Tom Lasater in 1931 near Falfurrias, Texas.



"It is one of the few true breeds developed in the United States," said van Riet, who also noted that the Foundation Herd was moved to Colorado in 1949."

Van Riet said Lasater crossed three breeds - the Brahman, Hereford and Shorthorn when he began his project. Van Riet stated the Hereford was picked because it was the standard breed at the time on the western range. The Shorthorn was selected because it added a great deal more milk production and thus heavier weaning weights and the Brahman was chosen for its adaptability, hardiness and disease resistance.

"The Beefmaster produces a small calf that makes calving easy and yet still grows to a heavy weaning weight with 600 pounds and better not uncommon," said van Riet.
