FOUNDATION FACTS

NCA Convention Attended by Record Number of FBA Members

The recent NCA Convention in Phoenix, Arizona was considered a success by all those attending. Representing FBA as a newly appointed Director to NCA board was O.C. Rampley of Silverton, TX. O.C. and wife, Faye, attended several other events as did FBA members, Lewis and Fran Lee, Jack and Bev Sparrowk. Helping man the FBA both were Joyce Campbell, Shelby Phillips III, FBA President Steve Flake and Mary Wilkinson, Executive Secretary.

Futures trading, animal rights, beef safety, cattle marketing and agricultural policy are among the timely issues on which the National Cattlemen's Association has new or updated positions for 1989.

NCA members, at their recent annual convention in Phoenix, adopted 84 new or amended policy resolutions and directives. The 1989 resolutions are in addition to policy positions which remain unchanged and which will continue to guide NCA's government and industry affairs work.

Referring to the current government investigation of futures trading in Chicago, the marketing committee developed a member-approved resolution calling for support of the investigation and "prosecution, to the fullest extent of the law, of any persons or companies found guilty of charges." Other resolutions called for continued work to obtain cash settlement of live cattle contracts and for continued support of cash settlement of feeder cattle contracts. The new marketing committee chairman, David True, is naming a subcommittee, headed by Jack Frick of Kansas, to monitor futures developments. This subcommittee will follow up on work done previously by a special futures task force.

Acting in an area related by both foreign trade and beef safety, members adopted a resolution which calls the European hormone ban a "protectionist trade barrier unsubstantiated by any scientific reasoning."

The resolution supports U.S. trade officials' actions to oppose the directive and resolve the issue.

A resolution originated by the animal health committee says NCA should continue to monitor the animal rights issue and related actions and "take appropriate action when necessary." Another resolution calls on

livestock producers to follow accepted practices in livestock management, health and care.

In the ag policy area, a resolution points out that government programs for given commodities may have "side effects" on other commodities. USDA will be asked for impact studies of any farm legislation with possible effects on other segments of agriculture.

Discussions at the convention noted that there has been a lot of talk about, but not yet much action to obtain, a value-based cattle marketing system, in place of the system which is based on averages and does not necessarily pay cattlemen what their cattle are worth. A directive adopted by the members says that NCA should form a task force to define problems, establish research priorities, and produce a specific plan to develop and implement a value-based system. Another directive calls for a task force to study and implement an instrument grading system that will accurately identify both quality and cutability factors.

Here are additional resolutions and directives approved at the convention:

Ag Policy. Allow planting or maintaining any soil conserving crop on allowable base acres without loss of feed grain or wheat base. Support the concept of a grain reserve owned by producers—not subsidized to the point that burdensome surpluses develop.

Animal Health. Restore brucellosis program funding to the fiscal 1988 level of \$65 million. Any regulation of the development and use of biotechnological products should be handled by USDA. Urge states to facilitate movement of cattle from brucellosis-free states. Initiate studies to show the ability to trace any fed cattle back to their source, distinguishing between traceback and mandatory identification. Ask USDA to develop a new or alternative plan for brucellosis eradication.

Consumer Relations. Help assure that organizations, agencies and communicators receive new USDA handbook 8-13 data on beef compositions when the revised data (showing still lower fat content when beef is cooked with 1/4 or 0 inch trim instead of 1/2 inch) are published.

Foreign Trade. Ask that U.S. beef exports be labeled as U.S. beef. Ask the Defense Department to buy U.S. beef for all of its commissaries.

Marketing. The industry should work for a comprehensive program to prevent livestock market default problems. A new directive outlined auction market sanctions. NCA is to name a committee to work with others and review certain Packer & Stockyards Act provisions and possibly suggest changes.

Private Lands & Environmental Management. Oppose any further government acquisitions of property which impair property rights. Oppose wild and scenic rivers bills. See that concepts and principles are followed in connection with government animal damage control program. Study possible effects of acquisition of U.S. land by foreign investors.

Public Lands. The federal government should stand the costs of maintaining range damaged by wild horses. Oppose acquisitions of private land in the name of conservation or public use. Oppose proposals for mandatory fencing of riparian areas along streams on public lands, except under certain circumstances. Influence government to ensure that livestock, lumber and mineral use of public lands is in equal standing with wildlife and recreation use.

Research and Education. Urge industry-wide support of USDA's carcass data service so that producers can have information needed for product improvements. To help seedstock producers evaluate breeding stock for transmission of carcass characteristics (in connection with efforts to develop a value-based marketing system), coordinate efforts to use existing carcass data in developing a means to calculate expected progeny differences, and seek standardization of EPD calculations and baseline data among breeds.

Tax and Credit. Establish an oversight subcommittee to follow Farm Credit System actions in complying with the Farm Credit Act of 1987. Continue to oppose any efforts to restrict the availability of cash accounting.
