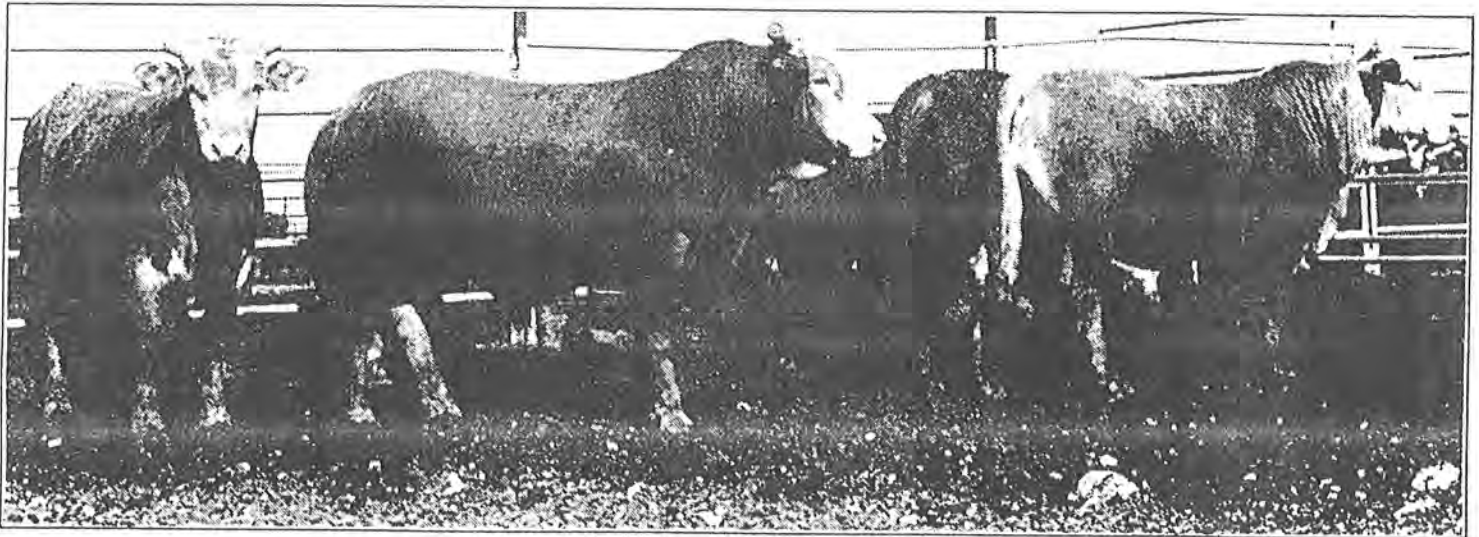

BEEF "ON FORAGE" BEEFMASTER BULL TEST

The growth of the Central Texas Beefmaster Breeders Beef "ON" Forage Bull Test was evident Saturday, June 10, as the group hosted one of the most successful Field Days yet. Over 175 cattlemen from Texas, Arkansas and Oklahoma inspected the largest single breed group of total forage tested bulls in Texas.

Guest speaker Dr. Bill Turner, head of the Animal Science Department, Texas A & M University, gave his views of the new cattle industry. He explained the use of ultrasound technology to determine Rib-Eye area and fat thickness measurements as a new selection tool in our breeding programs, but he stressed that muscling should not be used as a single trait selection.

Dr. Neal Pratt, Extension Forage Specialist, Texas A & M University, discussed the Texas Forage and Grassland Council's Forage Bull Development Program and how CTBB was the leader in the Bull Evaluation performance program by recognizing and using a highly successful forage practice.

The group expressed a great deal of interest in Beefmasters, F.B.A., CTBB and their Beef "ON" Forage Bull Test. The 91 bulls have been on forages since January and individual weights have been taken every 28 days during the development period. Growth data and within-herd ratios are provided to each breeder during the program and total performance information, including weaning weights, gain weights, weight per day of age, ratios, scrotal circumference and ultrasound rib-eye measurements will be available at the sale. Daily animal and forage management is practiced to allow each animal the opportunity to express its genetic potential.

The 91 bulls on test are within 90 days of age and will average 22 months at sale time. Each bull will have passed a complete Breeding Soundness Exam, fertility and health test, and will be fully guaranteed. An October 21, 1989 Sale in Brenham, Texas is planned and everyone is invited to attend. A video tape of the bulls is available to prospective buyers and interested parties. 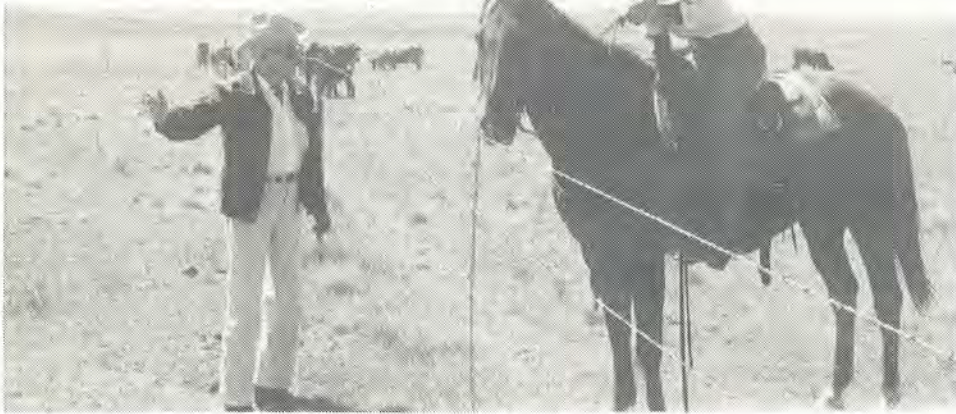

SERVICES

Analysis and Goal Setting: This represents a comprehensive effort to study an operation's past, review its current status and explore its future possibilities. 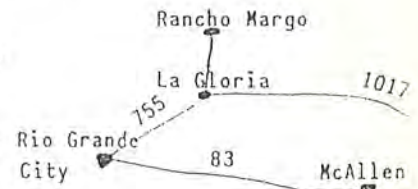

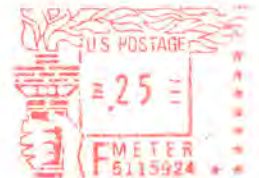
