JULY OBSERVATIONS

Seems it's the natural evolution for all of us as we get into the cattle business to first build numbers and then begin to get serious improving them. This is certainly the case with the six essentials.

It has been my experience that it is difficult to attack all six with equal intensity. It seems that if you can stay in the perimeter with all of them, then begin to purify each of the essentials as you get better at it, one at a time, that's the way it has to be accomplished.

The cattle prices are the best of my life and it is certainly the time to be tough and insist on total performance. Prices being paid at the local auctions are equal to or better than what we're used to getting for breeding stock. Often it's a temptation, when we have a cow that doesn't perform, to try to get her in condition (pregnant, fat or looking good), to sell to someone else as a breeder. This is

not something we should consider and the prices being paid for cull stock should dampen that temptation.

I think it behooves all of us to again study the "Lasater Philosophy of Cattle Raising," and see how we're doing on the six essentials, define "what we call fit" and get tough. The competition with other breeds continues to get tougher and therefore in order to get our share of the market we have to have cattle that are inherently high in the six essential characteristics. Dispose of those with unacceptable calves, those with a bad attitude, those not pregnant, the unthrifty and the ones who's conformation doesn't measure up. At that time, we hope we still have some left. Have at it!

CATTLEMEN ANGRY OVER ANTI-MEAT CAMPAIGN

Angry reactions by cattlemen are spreading in response to news that country music singer k.d. lang is appearing in an anti-meat television and print campaign. Production of the ads began in June, with release scheduled for later this summer.

Lang touched off a storm of angry protests from cattlemen in her native Alberta, Canada, when the syndicated TV program "Entertainment Tonight" featured her role as spokesperson in a planned "Meat Stinks" ad campaign.

U.S. cattlemen are equally upset about plans for the misleading ad campaign which apparently will include a TV commercial with lang petting a cow and saying "We all love animals -- but why do we call some pets and others dinner? Meat stinks and not just for animals but also for human health and the environment."

The anti-meat advertising is being underwritten by the radical animal rights group PETA (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals).

"There are no credible scientific facts to support the campaign's message that beef is bad for human health and the environment," said John Lacey, president of the National Cattlemen's Association. Responding to the campaign's apparent health message, Lacey noted that the American Heart Association and other respected health groups recognize beef as an important part of a well-balanced, heart-healthy diet. In addition, Lacey said, "Taking good care of our animals and using natural resources responsibly are essential to our livelihood.

"As a cattleman and a country music fan, I'm very disturbed to see someone who supposedly has an audience that understands the importance of American agriculture attacking an industry which is the largest segment of our agricultural economy," said Lacey, a California cattleman.

Lacey noted that NCA is receiving calls from cattle producers throughout the country who are angry about the

The rest of the cows drug up with only one live calf per cow which kept dropping our per cent calf crop until it finally bottomed out at the end of the season with a mere 102%!!! Well, maybe next year....

The sire of most of these calves is an 8-1/2 year old Watt Casey HERD SIRE, #173. He's for sale at \$2000.00

I'd like to say we're very proud of a bull we call 'Video Vic'. We bought him by calling in a bid to Laurie Lasater after viewing the video of the Spring, 1990 Isa bull sale. That was the easiest bull buying I ever did.

A final note: I understand that the genetics of the horned trait in *Bos indicus* (Brahma) cattle involves MANY more genes than it does in *Bos taurus* cattle. Consequently, breeding the horns off our cattle may be done only at the expense of jeopardizing several other ESSENTIAL traits. If you must have the polled head, go slow and be careful!

misleading attack on their industry and about the fact that a country music star would use her public position as a forum to promote an anti-meat agenda not based on science or fact.

"Cattlemen are telling us they plan to contact radio stations to protest the playing of k.d. lang records," Lacey said. "Others plan to contact the record company that records her songs to voice their outrage."

Lacey said the industry is looking carefully at this situation and will formulate an appropriate response based on facts. "But," he added, "you can't criticize cattlemen for fighting back when their livelihood is falsely attacked."

As a memorial to late wildlife biologist Allen D. Broussard, his family has underwritten the addition of 838 acres to Catfish Creek Preserve.

Allen D. Broussard Remembered *Chapter Enlarges Catfish Creek Preserve*

In a continuing effort to protect imperiled wildlife and lands along the Lake Wales Ridge, The Nature Conservancy has secured an 838-acre addition to Catfish Creek Preserve. The Polk County property was just minutes away from being converted to pasture land when the Conservancy stepped in.

Conservancy involvement was made possible by Dr. and Mrs. William Broussard of Indiatlantic who are underwriting the project as a memorial to their late son, wildlife biologist Allen Broussard. Legislation to obtain funds from the state to match the Broussards' contribution and to name the preserve after Allen Broussard was passed during the recent legislative session.

Located approximately 15 miles southeast of Dundee on Lake Pierce, the tract is an important hunting and nesting area for bald eagles, as well as habitat for scrub jays, gopher tortoises and several other threatened species. Its rolling ridges and ponds also shelter sandhill cranes and globally imperiled cutthroat grass.

This property, along with the Conservancy's earlier purchase of 309 acres, lies within a 5,951-acre site approved for acquisition by the state. Until time of transfer, the Conservancy holdings will be managed as a wildlife sanctuary by the Florida Chapter. Both the state and the Conservancy will continue efforts to protect the entire site.
