Central Texas Beefmaster Breeders Beef "On" Forage Bull Test Field Day

Consignors and Sponsors of the Fifth Annual Beef "ON" Forage Beefmaster Bull Test will be hosting a Field Day Saturday, June 29, 9:00 a.m. 115 Foundation bred bulls are being forage tested under the guidelines of the Texas Forage and Grassland Council Forage Bull Development Program at the Mark Kasner Ranch, east of Rosebud, Texas.

The purpose of this test is to identify those bulls having a superior genetic ability to convert forages to beef by comparing contemporaries within an age and breed group in a uniform grazing environment. All bulls are within 90 days of age and are being weighted every 28 days during the development period. These bulls will sell October 19 in Brenham, Texas, with complete performance information to include: adjusted 205 day weaning weights, gain

weights, weight per day of age, ratios, rib-eye measurements and scrotal circumference.

The Field Day will include guest speakers, complimentary BBQ lunch, door prizes (2-\$500 Certificates), Sponsor displays, refreshments and inspection of the 115 bulls. The Bull Test Facility is located on F.M. 2027, 10 miles east of Rosebud. If you are unable to attend, a video tape of the bulls will be available to prospective buyers. Mike and Patsy Ziler of Reeds, Missouri, had the first place futurity heifer; second place was from Larry Buster, Oologah, Oklahoma and third place was Lyle Clements, Jasper, Missouri.

Southern Beefmaster Breeders Forage Tested Bull Sale

Southern Beefmaster Breeders held their first forage tested bull sale April 13, 1991. The bulls averaged 15 months of age and had been gain tested on ryegrass grazing for 140 days. 22 bulls sold for an average of \$1,042.

Hillview 9001, consigned by Gerry Holmes, Falkville, AL, was the high selling lot at \$1,450. The bull posted the highest adjusted 205 day weaning weight of 653 lbs and highest weight per day of age of 2.90 lbs. Barry Wallace, Columbia, MS, purchased the bull.

Second high selling lot was War Eagle 23 consigned by Jerry Shaw and W.H. Gregory III, Opelika, AL. He had an adjusted 205 day weight of 623 and was the high gaining bull of 135 tested on the Southwest Mississippi Forage Test. He sold to Larry Boyd, Ruth, MS for \$1,400.

Third high selling lot was Wallace 033 consigned by Wallace Beefmasters, Magnolia, MS. The polled bull had an adjusted 205 day weight of 620 pounds and sold to Charles Hillsman, Watkinville, GA, for \$1,350.



We are conducting a survey of Beefmaster Breeders to determine the feasibility of a female production sale. If we receive sufficient response to this letter, we intend to have a sale this fall at our San Angelo, Texas facility for commercial and purebred Beefmaster females. The demand for commercial Beefmaster females is extremely strong in Texas. This strong demand for the commercial female would put a good floor under the purebred animals. This event will be well advertised over a multi state area. With an adequate number of cattle, we can sell these cattle for 3% commission which is very competitive.

It is our thinking there is a need to establish a recognized market for these animals that are beginning to be produced in large volume. Properly supported, we believe this sale could become an important part of the Beefmaster production industry.

Please call or write if you have any interest in this marketing program. We believe we could arrange trucking to combine less than load lots so that these animals could be transported to the sale from long distances at a reasonable cost.

Experts' Quotes on Beef's Role in the American Diet

"Women who think they can substitute meat with a spinach salad for their iron needs are really fooling themselves, because the iron that is available in the vegetable source is not nearly as well utilized as meat." **Mary Abbot Hess, president of the American Dietetic Association.**

"The American Cancer Society's guidelines do not recommend completely eliminating red meat from the diet. The Society believes that eaten in moderation, lean red meat can be a part of a balanced diet." **Dr. Gerald Murphy, Chief Medical Officer, American Cancer Society.**

"While the American Dietetic Association supports increased dietary emphasis on vegetables, fruits, grains and legumes, we can not advocate dropping meat and dairy products from the basic food groups. A diet with moderate quantities of lean meat, poultry, fish and low fat dairy products is more likely to meet total nutrient needs than one without these foods. Control of portion sizes and informed choices within the traditional food groups can provide diets that have healthful levels of fat, saturated fat and cholesterol. Even now, many Americans don't meet recommended daily allowances of calcium, iron, zinc and critical B vitamins. Lean varieties of meat and dairy products remain the primary source of these nutrients, which are essential to maintaining healthy bones, blood and factors that promote immunity to diseases." **Mary Abbott Hess, M.S., R.D. President, American Dietetic Association.**

"Animal protein in the diet provides trace minerals and B vitamins, especially B6, that you don't get from other sources. Work shows these minerals and vitamins are absorbed more efficiently when there is animal protein in the diet. Most work has indicated that meat consumption is not a risk factor for cancer." **Dr. David Kritchevsky, associate director of the Wistar Institute, a biomedical research institute based in Philadelphia.**

"The four food groups were created to help consumers make sound dietary decisions. The elimination of meat and dairy products from the diet would destroy the whole concept of a balanced diet." **Dr. Robert Olson, professor of medicine at the State University of New York at Stony Brook.**

"The truth is there are no good foods or bad foods -- just good and bad diets. The elimination of one or more food groups is ill-advised." **Dr. Paul Saltman, Ph.D, a professor of biology at the University of California at San Diego.**

These bulls are being forage tested under the guidelines of the Texas Forage and Grassland Council Forage Bull Development Program. We have taken an innovative approach to developing breeding age bulls with no preferential pampering by growing and performance testing these bulls on a 300 day forage program.

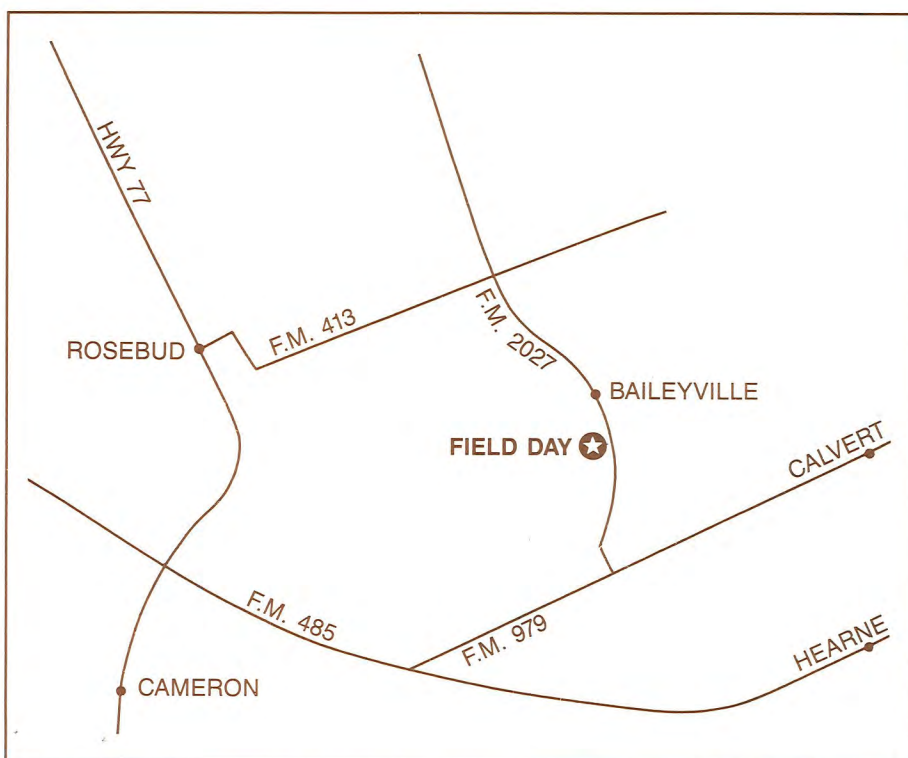
The purpose of the test is to identify those bulls having a superior genetic ability to convert forages to beef by comparing contemporaries within an age and breed group in a uniform grazing environment. Consumer-wise, the trend is for leaner beef, so the feedlot period is being shortened, which means a calf going to slaughter is going to spend 75 to 85 percent of its life on pasture. With average daily gain about 35 percent heritable, cattlemen will benefit by being able to purchase potential sires that have been developed under range conditions similar to their farm and ranch. The 300 day development program will consist of winter phase and summer phase with bull's weights being taken every 28 days during the development period.

Currently the bulls average 16 months of age and are within 90 days of age. These bulls will have completed the winter phase of the forage test and all performance data will be available. An October 19, 1991 Sale at Brenham, Texas is being planned and each bull will sell with a complete performance evaluation to include: adjusted 205 w.w., gain wts., yearling weights, weight per day of age, ratios, Rib Eye measurements and scrotal circumference.

Join us Saturday, June 29, as sponsors of the Field Day will present various livestock supplies, ranch equipment and displays. Guest speakers, complimentary B-B-Q lunch, refreshments, pasture tours, door prizes (**Two \$500 gift certificates**) and inspection of the 115 Beefmaster Bulls will highlight the day.
