FOUNDATION FACTS

BEEF WILL BE LEADING MEAT AGAIN IN 1992, NCA SAYS

Denver, Colorado, December 31, 1991 – Americans again will eat more beef than any other meat in 1992, the National Cattlemen's Association pointed out today.

Meat supplies, in total and on a per capita basis, will be record large next year, economists noted, and retail meat prices are expected to average lower than in 1991. The retail beef average is expected to be close to the 1991 average (\$2.61 per pound, all grades of beef).

Chuck Lambert, NCA director of economics, said that on a retail weight basis as generally reported, average annual per capita consumption of chicken now tops beef consumption. However, on the basis of actual retail weight as well as boneless, edible weight, beef remains well ahead of chicken and pork.

"During the last three years," Lambert said, "the U.S. Department of Agriculture has revised per capita retail-weight data for beef and pork in order to reflect closer trimming of fat on retail cuts and also increased sale of boneless products. However, USDA has not yet revised its data for chicken. As a result, reported retail weight consumption figures for chicken include all the bone, skin, gizzard, fat, neck and other parts not generally sold retail. The currently reported chicken retail weight is essentially a carcass weight rather than a retail weight like the retail weights reported for red meats."

"The fact is that amounts of chicken actually purchased and eaten by consumers are considerably smaller than the generally reported figures. For example, it is estimated that at least 13% of the reported retail weight of chicken is sold for use in pet food. Estimates are that the retail per capita consumption figure for chicken may be overstated by at least 20 lbs. Actual average per capita use on a retail weight basis in 1991 is probably not more than 56 lbs., compared to a reported 76 lbs. per capita. Beef consumption on a retail weight basis is estimated at 67.6 lbs, or substantially greater than chicken consumption."

Lambert went on to note that average per capita consumption of beef on a boneless, edible weight basis in 1991 is an estimated 63.8 lbs. Under USDA's current formula for determining boneless weight, chicken consumption is 52.6 lbs. However, because some of the skin, neck meat, giblets and other parts do not go into the retail or food service market, actual boneless edible per capita chicken consumptions is probably less than 50 lbs. per year.

Furthermore, Lambert said, when cooking losses (moisture and fat) and at-home trimming are considered, it is obvious that

Americans are eating considerably less meat in total—probably an average of not more than 6 oz. cooked, per person, per day—than often is assumed.

Lambert and economist with Cattle-Fax, a cattle and beef market information service associated with NCA, estimate that average per capita consumption of the different meats on a boneless, edible, raw basis in 1992 will be: Beef, 63.8 lbs.; pork, 51.0; veal, 0.8; lamb, 1.1; chicken, 47.8; and turkey, 15.4. Total red meat and poultry consumption will be about 180 lbs. in 1992 – a record high.

The beef industry is currently in a herd rebuilding phase, said Tommy Beall, director of market research for Cattle-Fax. The total cattle herd on Jan. 1, 1992, is expected to be about 102 million head, up 2% from a year earlier. Beef production next year will be even to up 2%, to a total of approximately 23 billion pounds. For the first time since 1985, production of beef, pork, chicken and turkey all will be larger than a year earlier. The result will be an increase of an estimated 5% in total red meat and poultry output.

While total beef output will be up, average per capita beef supplies will not increase. That is because of larger exports and population growth.

Tom Brink, Cattle-Fax research analyst, said that the large total meat supplies—including red meat and poultry—likely will mean lower average livestock and poultry prices and, in turn, lower average retail meat prices next year.

"For consumers," Brink said, "the bottom line is that meat supplies will be very ample in 1992, and prices will be favorable for consumers."

"With big meat supplies and large numbers of heavy cattle, cattle prices recently have been down substantially from a year earlier," Beall said. "Cattle feeders have been losing money, and prices paid to cow herd operators for calves and cattle to go into feedlots have decreased. However, most breeding herd operators have been in a profitable position for several years, and barring adverse weather, herds—and beef production—are expected to grow further during the next couple of years."

As measured by per capital expenditures as well as per capita supplies and consumption, beef continues as the leading meat, Lambert said. And, with further improvements in beef products—such as more closely trimmed retail cuts and new low-fat ground beef products—beef should continue to be No. 1 in 1992 and subsequent years.

SIXTH ANNUAL BEEF "ON" FORAGE TEST UNDERWAY

The Central Texas Beefmaster Breeders have started their Sixth Annual Beef "On" Forage Test. 27 members have consigned 138 top end bulls to the 300 day test which started on November 16. The bulls were delivered to the Clifton Marek Ranch south of Lexington, Texas where they will remain throughout the test. After a 28 day warm up period the bulls will be weighed every 28 days.

The bulls entered have an average adjusted 205 day weight of 615 pounds and a W.D.A. of

2.59 pounds. The bulls will sell October 17, in Brenham, Texas. Complete performance information will be available to include actual weaning weight, adjusted 205 day W.W., yearling weight, A.D.G. and Ratio, W.D.A and ratio, ribeye measurements and scrotal circumference. SOUTHERN BEEFMASTER BREEDERS BULL TEST

For the second year, Southern Beefmaster Breeders are utilizing the Southwest Mississippi Forage Bull Test as their official bull test.

This year's consignment includes bulls from the herds of Brumfield, Gowan, and Wallace. The bulls are being gain tested on ryegrass pasture for 140 days. They will sell April 11, 1992, at the Livestock Sale Facility in Tylertown, Mississippi. Sale day information will include 205 day weaning weights, 140 day grass gain, scrotal circumferences, pelvic area measures, and frame scores. The bulls will have

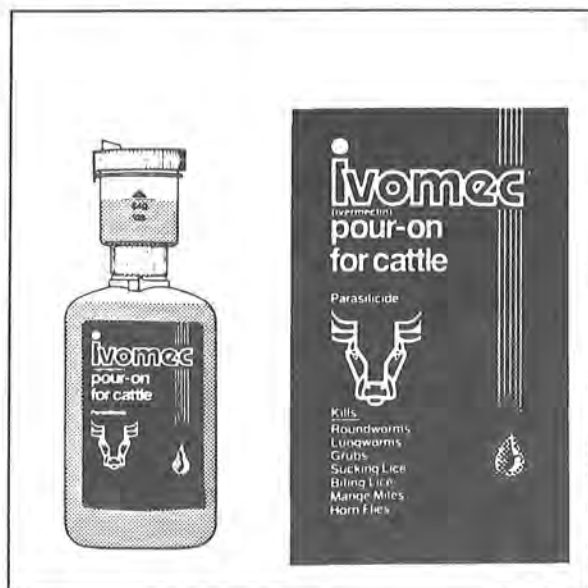
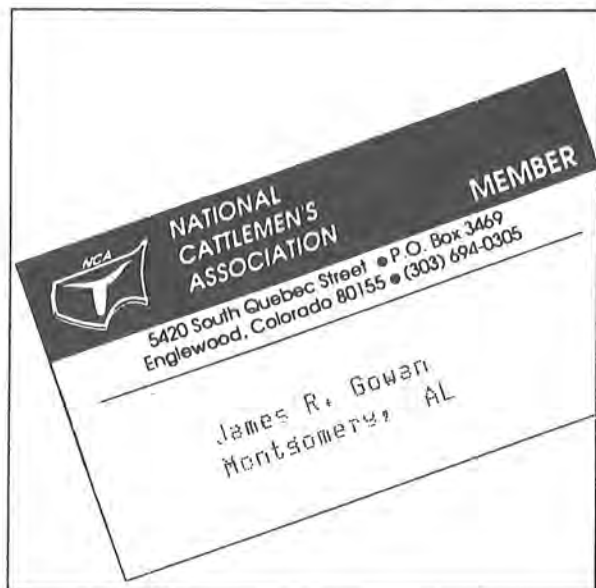
had a complete breeding soundness exam. The bulls will be 14-17 months old on sale day.

At the mid-point weighing in early January, a bull consigned by Hyland Brumfield and one consigned by Barry Wallace had each gained 220 lbs. and were posting an average daily gain of 3.28 lbs.
