A Message from The Board of Directors

A Message From the Board of Directors

To All Association Members:

We are fast approaching the June 30, 1992 deadline, before which you may certify any of your Beefmaster cattle at a reduced price of \$12 per certificate. We would like to encourage all of our members to take full advantage of this opportunity before that date. We would also like to make some statements which may clarify some of the misunderstandings on the certificate issue.

1. You may certify ANY Beefmaster animal at \$12 per head until June 30, 1992.
2. After the June 30, 1992 deadline, any Beefmaster animal born before Dec. 31, 1990, is grandfathered and may still be certified at the old certificate price of \$35 per head.
3. After the June 30, 1992, deadline, any animal born after Dec. 31, 1990 will be on the new fee schedule as printed in the 1992 FBA membership book. Cattle under 12 months old may continue to be certified at \$12 per head, etc.
4. Certification of your cattle is highly encouraged but it is not mandatory. It will remain strictly voluntary. We encourage you to use a month of birth on your certificates if possible to assist the office staff.
5. We recognize the need for an Association of Beefmaster Breeders in order to: a) Promote the breed through advertising, field days, seminars, publications, and other promotional activities b) Promote the underlying philosophy of cattle production which created the breed in the first place. c) To assist in the unity and consistency of the individual breeders, by allowing them to certify their cattle with a common Certificate of Breeding which ties them to their individual cattle. d) To provide opportunities for individual breeders to meet together to advance common goals.
6. The principal method of financing the Association is through dues and through issuing "Certificates of Breeding" for the membership on their cattle.
7. Reducing the price of the "Certificate of Breeding" was done to allow and encourage ALL of our members to more equally share in the cost of maintaining the Association, and to economically encourage individual breeders to stand behind their cattle with a common certificate.
8. The reduced certificate price will only work if all members who are committed to the Breed and to the

common Association goals will do their part.

9. A person usually gets out of something about what he puts into it.

We would like to end by quoting from a letter from Dale Lasater, manager of the Lasater Ranch and a son of Tom Lasater, to a member in Africa who is dropping his membership because of a disagreement over the role of the Association in individual breeder's activities. We believe it says a lot about our Association, our philosophy and hopefully, our cattle. It also demonstrates the need for the Association.

"When Dad agreed to assisting a group of Beefmaster breeders write up the necessary bylaws and assist in forming a breed association in 1960, it was with the explicit understanding that the association would not attempt to police or control its members. This very central idea resulted from Dad's observation that all other breed associations' past efforts to police their members and to put a tacit stamp of approval on the members' individual production had failed. Therefore, this would be a loose confederation of breeders with certain very general common interests, who would pool their resources to promote the breed and the underlying philosophy of cattle production. When the BBU board twenty years ago, began the move toward a traditional breed association's framework, the Foundation Beefmaster Association was formed."

"The most critical factor in our association's policy continues to be the name franchise, which permanently ties each Beefmaster to the breeder and is, by extension, the principal recommendation and the primary identification of the animal."

"FBA does not attempt to verify the veracity of the information any individual member supplies on the bill of sale and application for the certificate of breeding. Why? Because the association does not think it useful or possible to police its members, except in the case of a flagrant violation which can be easily substantiated. That was the central issue in 1960 and again when the association split took place eleven years later."

"Ultimately we are confident that each individual breeder's integrity, ability as a breeder and commitment to producing productive cattle will determine the success or failure of each individual Beefmaster breeder's enterprise. Along the way, any number of cattle have been misrepresented at the time of sale (half-bred or three quarter animals certified as Beefmasters and so on), and many cattle have been sold for breeding purposes which should have been knocked in the head. If you have visited

SIX L CATTLE COMPANY SALE

Sale Manager, Duke Phillips; Auctioneer Harley Troyer

Cattlemen from nine states attended the 4th Annual Six L Cattle Company Beefmaster bull sale on Saturday, April 11, held at the Lasater Ranch, Matheson, Colorado. This offering included yearling and long-yearling bulls raised by the Lasaters, Flint Hills Beefmasters, Beaumont, Kansas and Butler Ranch Associates, Avondale, Colorado.

Twenty-three buyers paid \$91,750 for 63 bulls, 22 long-yearling bulls averaged \$1,566 and 41 yearling bulls averaged \$1,397. The two top selling bulls sold to Appel Ranch Beefmasters, Gillette, Wyoming, for \$2,550 and \$2,250. Julius Roberts, Walsenburg, CO purchased the third high selling lot for \$2,200. Roberts and his son Tim were among the volume buyers with 5 bulls. Key Beefmasters, Lamoille, NV was volume buyer, taking 20 bulls for \$25,400.

Other volume buyers included James Wells, Three Rivers, CA, 6 bulls; Ed Ingo, Ridgway, CO, 4 bulls; and Glen Murchison, Pflugerville, TX, 3 bulls.

many herds in this country, you already know that in every herd, even some raised by honest and dedicated people, some animals are not a credit to the Beefmaster breed."

"BBU claims to be numerically much larger than FBA, and certainly they have succeeded in promoting a certain approach to raising Beefmasters. There are now hundreds, perhaps thousands, of Beefmaster breeders who know nothing of the ideas and principles on which the breed was founded. Many of them have not read Laurie's book, and do not even have a remote idea why Dad might have done what he did in the early decades of the Beefmaster development."

"All we can do is continue raising and promoting cattle that we believe in, in a manner we consider to be practical, efficient and sustainable. This herd (along with many others

belonging to FBA) continues to be subjected to the same selection program initiated decades ago. We continue to believe that the six essentials form a very good basis for defining the productive characteristics that we concentrate on, along with sound feet, moderate sheaths and other related traits."

We encourage every Breeder to be actively involved in improving and advancing your own cattle, the breed and the Association. We believe that certifying your cattle will aid in all three.

BEEF "ON" FORAGE BEEFMASTER BULL TEST

Dear Cattlemen:

Consignors and sponsors of the Sixth Annual Beef "ON" Forage, Beefmaster Bull Test, will be hosting a Field Day, Saturday, June 6th, 9:00 am at the Bull Test Facility, Lexington, Texas. The 130 bulls are consigned by 27 members of the Central Texas Beefmaster Breeders (Satellite of the Foundation Beefmaster Association), and are being forage tested under the guidelines of the Texas Forage and Grassland Council Forage Bull Development Program.

The purpose of the test is to identify those bulls having a superior genetic ability to convert forages to beef by comparing contemporaries within an age and breed group in an uniform grazing environment. The 300 day development program will consist of winter phase and summer phase with bull's weights being taken every 28 days during the development period.

Currently the bulls average 16 months of age and are within 90 days of age. These bulls will have completed the 140 day winter phase of the forage test and all performance information

are available. An October 17, 1992 Sale at Brenham, Texas is planned and each bull will sell with complete performance evaluation to include: adjusted 205 day w.w., yearling weights, gain weights, weight per day of age, ratios, rib-eye measurements and scrotal circumference.

Join us June 6, for an informative day which includes speakers, refreshments, lunch, pasture tours, door prizes, (2 - \$500.00 Certificates) sponsor products and displays and inspection of the 130 Beefmaster Bulls.

The Bull Test Facility is located at the Clifton Market Ranch on FM 3403, 1/2 mile off Highway 77, 3 miles south of Lexington, Texas. If you are unable to attend, a video tape of the bulls will be available to prospective buyers and interested parties. DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

During the recent FBA Board of Directors meeting in Denver, the membership committee, including myself, had the opportunity to review numerous replies from previous FBA members electing not to renew their membership with FBA for the coming year. Reasons ranged from retirement, illness, herd liquidation, sale of the ranch, etc. But, two letters remain clearly in the back of my mind. One addressed a fertility problem in a group of heifers, that they had purchased. The other regarded the quality and dispositions of cattle consigned to a purebred sale.

"The pedigree is in the name." a quote that can clearly identify every animal with its breeder. But, yet, new breeders and potential buyers not familiar with the prefix name or the Name Franchise Contract, tend to place blame on the entire Beefmaster breed, not on the integrity of the individual breeder and his herd program.

We must strive for fertility not only in our bulls, but in our females as well. We need to educate new breeders and potential customers of the six essentials. We have to demand that the bulls reach maturity at an early age and the heifers to calf as two year olds, slaughtering those that fail to meet this standard. As stated

in The Beefmaster Story, "Fertility, from an economic standpoint, is the most important trait to consider when selecting beef cattle. An unproductive animal is an expense to its owner, not an asset."

In regards to cattle consigned to a purebred sale. Select **only** the top quality animals meeting all six essentials. Do not use the sale as a dumping round for cattle you cannot sell at home. Take the best and only the best. These sales are an important advertising tool in displaying to everyone in attendance the type of cattle back home. That animal represents you, your ranch, and your management program. While Gayle Evans was President of FBA back in 1981, he frequently wrote presidential messages title "Don't Lose North". Let's not lose that direction we are heading to, the need to keep the six essentials and the philosophy is a must. Review the Lasater Philosophy of Cattle Raising, keep in touch with new breeders and buyers of your cattle. Possibly, giving them a copy of this book, to further help them produce functional cattle. Remember "Don't Lose North".

NCA SEEKS TO HEAD OFF MORE IRS PAPERWORK FOR CATTLE PRODUCERS

WASHINGTON, D.C., May 7, 1992—The National Cattlemen's Association this week attempted to head off more burdensome paperwork for cattlemen filing taxes, by pointing out how cattle producers and other agriculturalists would be burdened if the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) enacted a proposed ruling regarding Form 1099B filing requirements.

Under the proposed rule anyone acting as a broker buying agricultural products from non corporate sellers would be required to file Form 1099B information returns for tax purposes, or to obtain a sworn certificate if purchasing from the original producer. In the past the IRS has considered a broker any "middleman" engaged in buying or selling goods or services.

The proposal would allow a broker to be exempted from the 1099B filing requirements if purchasing from a non-corporate sellers by obtaining a sworn certificate proving that commodities had been or would be produced by the seller. The name, address and taxpayer identification number of both the seller and the broker would have to be on the certificate, which would have to be retained for at least four years.

In comments to the IRS on the proposal, NCA President Jimmie Wilson, Trout Creek, Mont., pointed out that these paperwork burdens, if imposed, would add burdensome costs to the beef industry. "As cattle move north and south, east and west across the United States, different forms of ownership and marketing are used to achieve the highest and best value for the animal," he said. "This volume of paper would impose new costs on the beef industry, inundate the IRS with unnecessary information and yield no benefit to taxpayers."

Additionally, the sworn certification option for the actual producers of the commodities would be unworkable, Wilson said. "In reality, compliance would be minimal and confusion would force buyers to file 1099B information returns to all unincorporated sellers," he said.

NCA has requested that the IRS continue the current transition rule which exempts agricultural commodities from 1099B filing requirements and sworn certification requirements, rather than enacting the new proposal.
