# FOUNDATION FACTS

## BE AN INFLUENCE!

As we go through the day to day routine of caring for our Beefmaster cattle – calving, weaning, selecting replacements, selling bulls and females - we sometime lose sight of what we are really producing: BEEF.

The end product of all our efforts eventually ends up in a clear wrapped package in a super market meat case. Our true customer is the American consumer. We may be selling bulls and females to other breeders or to commercial cattlemen but unless super markets can continue to sell beef all of us will be out of business.

We have had to teach ourselves to market our cattle. We are convinced that Beefmaster cattle are the finest available and we go to great effort to educate other cattlemen about the outstanding characteristics of the breed.

But how many of us exert the same amount of effort to the selling of the end product and the industry?

We wouldn't miss an opportunity to sell a live animal at profit, yet every day we pass up opportunities to educate the American public about and sell them on the importance of the beef cattle industry.

As many of you know, many of the western states are experiencing severe drought conditions. California is going into its seventh year of drought and Oregon, parts of Idaho, Washington, Montana and Nevada re struggling through conditions that are the driest recorded in nearly 100 years.

About a year ago, as California entered what should have been the rainy season (and wasn't), my husband, Jack, and I nudged each other Sunday after Sunday as our pastor thanked the Lord for the beautiful sunny weather. Finally, we began an all-out campaign to educate him on the effects of the drought on our state.

We began by telling him that the San Joaquin Valley produces one-seventh of the world's food, the economy of

our county is based on agriculture and agriculture is still the largest industry in California. We continued with the importance of irrigation, surface water, ground water, and the correlation between rainfall and forage growth and the importance to livestock production. The kicker, of course, was an explanation of production costs as they relate to prices in the store.

He began praying for rain every Sunday. And in doing so, he was passing along the message to 150-300 members of the congregation, every Sunday, that the production of food was more important than anyone's golf game.

I'm not suggesting that each of you make your minister an advocate for agriculture but we all come in contact with urban, suburban and even rural folks who are influenced by publicity negative to the cattle industry and to agriculture in general.

We do ourselves and our industry a great disservice if we don't take the time and make the effort to present our side to the consuming public.

A positive thought influencer has to be informed and rational to be effective. I would encourage you to read all you can and ask your local cattlemen's association and/or NCA to send you updates on issues. Then take advantage of every opportunity to use that information to educate a consumer.

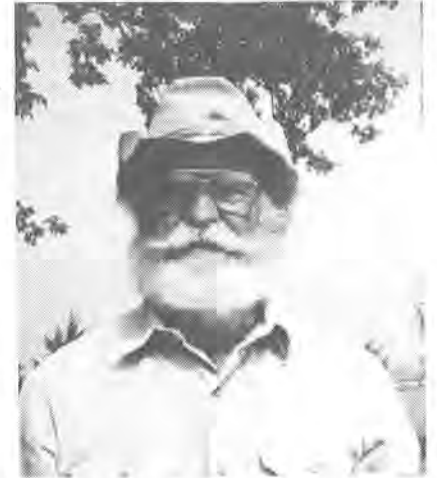
When BBU made it illegal for their members to also belong to FBA, it smacked of darkness, repression, and an insecure paranoia that is typical of people who are not sure they believe what they "believe". When they repealed that motion in February of this year, their motives may have been mixed, but it was nonetheless a step toward light, reality, accountability and truth. I understand the motives behind our countermove in making dual membership illegal, but I think it was a mistake. Our directors reasoned that a flood of dual members might join and pirate off our association with their votes; either they'd cause us to join BBU or they'd lead us astray from FBA's ideals. I am personally zealous for FBA's ideals and the Lasater Philosophy, but I believe there is only mildew in the darkness behind such walls. I much prefer the risks that accompany openness and confidence to the philosophical inbreeding that follows ideals hidden behind a protectionist mindset. Besides, all such walls eventually dry rot, opening closets of dinosaur skeletons.

An example of how light works is the motion that BBU will pass within a few weeks allowing the acceptance of inspected FBA cattle into their herdbook. BBU tried to merge with, (or absorb) FBA. They really don't see that they need us and who we are, but they know they need the cream of our cattle to improve their own genetics. By

## NCA APPLAUDS ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT REFORM BILL

WASHINGTON, D.C., Oct. 5, 1992 – The National Cattlemen's Association (NCA) wholeheartedly supports legislation introduced today to comprehensively reform the Endangered Species Act of 1973 into an effective law. NCA, which considers reforming the Endangered Species Act a top priority, co-chairs the Endangered Species Act Coordinating Council, a coalition seeking meaningful amendments to the law. The council includes beef producers, sheep producers, miners, timberland owners, tree farmers, the fisheries industry and AFL-CIO members.

"As it currently stands, the Endangered Species Act is so inflexible and punitive that it does not effectively protect truly endangered species," said NCA President Jimme Wilson of Trout Creek, Mont. "This bill would correct those flaws and provide incentives for cattle producers and other private citizens to be active in species conservation. The question is not whether to protect endangered species, but how to protect them."

Wilson pointed out that since cattle producers own or operate more land than any other business group in the nation they have a great interest in making the Endangered Species Act a workable law. One of NCA's top priorities this year has been to seek changes to the Endangered Species Act to protect private property rights and human needs, and to create positive incentives for the private sector's participation in species recovery.

The legislation was introduced by Reps. W.J. (Billy) Tauzin (D-La.) and Jack Fields (R-Texas), and 20 bipartisan cosponsors. NCA and other resource groups have worked closely with the sponsors during much of the last year to provide information used in this legislation. The goal was to arrive at a positive method for effectively protecting truly endangered species, rather than just

opposing measures that are ineffective, according to NCA's Chairman of Private Lands and Environment Jim Timmons of Arcata, Calif.

"Arriving at the conclusion that the Endangered Species Act is a broken law was not a difficult task," said Timmons. "The challenge was to find effective, workable changes that respect land use practices and property rights, while also protecting species. NCA took on considerable legal and biological research to develop and recommend amendments for the Endangered Species Act. After a year of intense work, we're pleased to know that this bill is the right measure to pro-actively reform the Endangered Species Act."

Reform measures in the Tauzin/Fields bill include: increasing scientific requirements for listing species as endangered; strengthening the process to recover endangered species to include more biological and economic impact information and concrete goals for removing them from the endangered list; recognizing protection of private property rights and providing compensation when significant property rights are lost; increasing incentives for innovative federal-state-local efforts to conserve species, including voluntary management agreements as an alternative to listing; increasing emphasis on propagation and species population support programs; and eliminating inequities that have imposed stricter standards for private land owners than for federal agencies.

The Tauzin/Fields Endangered Species bill likely will not see much action before the close of this session of Congress, but will be introduced again during the 103rd session of Congress as deliberations begin on reauthorization of the Endangered Species Act.

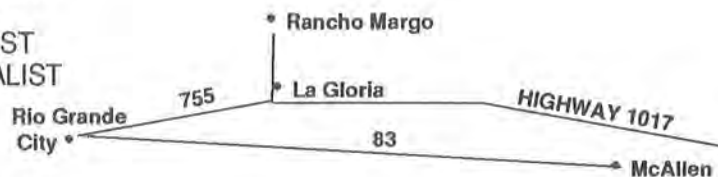
