FOUNDATION FACTS

CLINTON NAMES ESPY NEW AG SECRETARY

President-elect Clinton has tapped Rep. Mike Espy (D-Miss.), a third-term congressman from the Delta area, to serve as secretary of agriculture and has continuously voted with the beef industry on key issues. His work on the budget committee also has been helpful to agriculture, says NCA Director of Congressional Relations Chandler Keys. Jim Newsome, executive vice president of the Mississippi Cattlemen's Association, called Espy a true friend. Named as secretary of interior is former Arizona governor Bruce Babbitt. Babbitt currently is president of the League of Conservation Voters. As governor, he pioneered groundwater legislation and land-management reform. Other picks of interest to cattlemen are Los Angeles attorney and Clinton campaign chairman Mickey Kantor as U.S. Trade Representative and Florida Environmental Regulations Department Secretary (and former Al Gore legislative aide) Carol Browner as Environmental Protection of Agency Administrator. Donna Shalala, chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Madison, will serve as health and human services secretary. The nominees must be confirmed by the Senate. NCA is working to cultivate strong working relations with the new cabinet members and their staffs.

FINAL RULING MADE ON NUTRITION LABELING

USDA last week released its final rules on nutrition labeling. The regulations are similar to nutrition-labeling regulations released last year by the Food and Drug Administration. The USDA regulations call for voluntary nutrition on all fresh meat and poultry products. All food processors must comply with the regulations by July 6, 1994. USDA is also seeking comments regarding the use of the term "healthy" and its derivatives, on meat and poultry-product nutrition labels. NCA sees nutrition labeling of beef as an excellent opportunity to highlight beef's nutritional benefits.

CHIHUAHUA TAKES STEPS TO CONTROL TB

The Mexican state of Chihuahua initiated a bovine tuberculosis (TB) eradication program on Jan. 1. The eradication program resulted from producer-to-producer meetings of U.S. and Mexican cattlemen aimed at curbing the spread of bovine tuberculosis in Mexico. Several cases of bovine TB in the United States have been traced back to Mexican feeder cattle. At press time NCA Animal Health Committee Chairman Wes Bonner of Veribest, Texas, NCA Brucellosis, TB and Domestic Diseases Subcommittee Chairman Bill Gallagher of Stephen, S.D. and NCA Director of Animal Health Gary Wilson were in Chihuahua to learn how the Mexican TB program will operate.

CONGRESS CONVENES; ACTION WEEKS AWAY

The 103rd session of Congress opened last week with the swearing-in of one of the largest and most diverse groups of freshmen members ever. House committee appointments are nearly finalized, although Senate appointments may take a few more weeks. One Senate appointment of note to cattlemen is the designation of Sen. Max Baucus (D-Mont.) as chairman of the Senate Environmental and Public Works Committee. The Environment and Public Works Committee has jurisdiction over major pieces of legislation such as the Clean Water Act and Endangered Species Act. Little action on Congress' part is expected until mid-February. Congress currently is in recess until after the presidential inauguration on Jan. 20. Once Congress and the new administration do get down to business, legislation will be coming fast and furious, according to NCA Vice President, Government Affairs Tom Cook.


Thanks to all who came out to help weigh the bulls today. We weighed 156 bulls in one hour's time!! Thanks to both Dr. J. Neal Pratt and Dr. Donald Dorsett for coming out for the first official weighing of the 1993 Forage Test. Dr. Dorsett is currently our representative from the Texas Agricultural Extension Service stationed at Texas A&M University. Dr. Pratt is recently retired from TAEX but still plays an active role in the forage test. He is on his seventh year with the forage test. They are both forage specialists. The next weigh day will be on February 13th at 9:00 a.m.

Please look over the information on the weight report carefully. Check over the brand, birthdate, weaning date, and whether the bull is polled and if it is a calf from a heifer. Check carefully to see if the "computer" has made any errors as this will be the official record.

As you have already realized, the bulls lost weight as they do every year at this time. We do not know how to make this transition period any less stressful on the bulls. It takes more than two weeks on green pastures to get their rumen bacteria switched over to the "green grass" mode. Next weighing should prove to be more positive.

Just a reminder, the CTBB annual meeting will be held this Saturday (January 23rd) in Salado. There will be a social gathering in President Swearingen's suite Friday at 7:00 p.m. Everyone is welcome.

SOUTHERN BEEFMASTER BREEDERS BULL TEST

Southern Beefmaster Breeders have incorporated their forage test into the South Mississippi "Gain on Forage" bull test at Tylertown, Mississippi.

After 53 days, our test Wallace Beefmaster 203 led the 130 head all breed test with 165 pounds of gain. He was followed closely by War Eagle Beefmaster 6 with 160 pounds of gain.

The bulls will sell April 10, 1993 at the Livestock

Sale Facility, Tylertown, Mississippi. Complete performance data will be available including 205 day weights, 140 day gain on grass, weight per day of age, frame scores, pelvic area, scrotal circumference, and the bulls will have passed a breeding soundness exam. Dr. Ted Montgomery, Professor of Animal Science

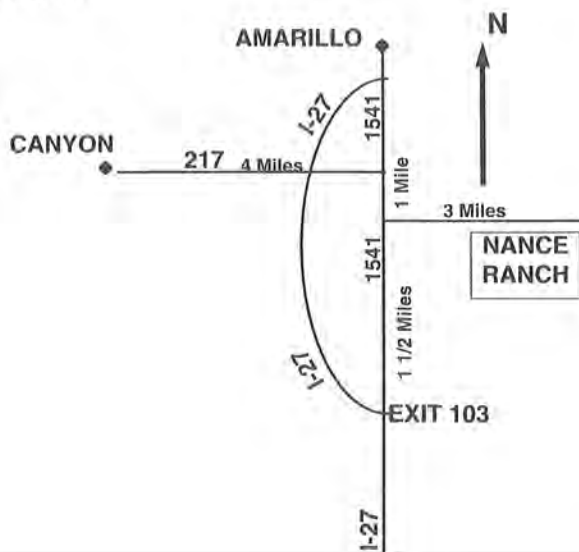

NCA WINS

NCA is in Washington, D.C. everyday of the year working on issues that will affect your business. However, Congress, federal agencies like USDA, EPA, FDA and special interest groups are working just as hard trying to influence your business.

Fortunately, as a direct result of NCA's work with Congress and federal agencies, the cattle industry has been able to enjoy the following victories:

WETLANDS

The NCA has been a strong voice for cattle producers in discussing revisions to the federal government's regulations of wetlands.

As the federal government's wetlands manual is updated, NCA has requested that better criteria be used to define wetlands and that if exemptions are provided in the manual, those exemptions clearly apply to haying, grazing and maintenance activities associated with those practices.

NCA is also actively supporting legislation that would make the above changes part of the federal Clean Water Act, in addition to the inclusion of exemptions for man-made wetlands.

Futhermore, NCA has expressed concern that a wetlands revision proposed by the Army Corps of Engineers to facilitate an out-of-court settlement of a lawsuit filed by the North Carolina Wildlife Federation could rewrite provisions of the Clean Water Act without apparent regard for congressional intent. NCA requested that the settlement, if adopted, provide more explicit exemptions for normal haying and grazing activities.

NCA actively participates in a Wetlands Task Force of more than 50 agricultural and commodity groups.

BREAK-IN BILL SIGNED

NCA scored a significant win in September when President Bush signed "break-in" legislation. The law makes it a felony to break into and cause damage to ranches, farms or animal-research facilities.

NCA strongly supports legislation that supports the cattle industry in its struggle with those special-interest groups that oppose cattle production practices.

GRAZING FEE INCREASE DEFEATED

Due to pressure from NCA, an arbitrary federal grazing-fee increase was stopped in Congress in September. The House version of the Interior appropriation bill would have increased fees by 33.3 percent, per year.

PRIVATE PROPERTY RIGHTS

NCA filed documents supporting rights of the property owner in a U.S. Supreme Court private-property "takings" case. The court ruled in favor of the property rights protection.

NCA ardently supports legislation to ensure that federal agencies assess the impact of regulatory proposals or action on private-property rights when possible.

ANIMAL HEALTH PRODUCTS

NCA is working with FDA and other relevant agencies to assure that a variety of affordable and effective animal health products remain on the market.

NCA MYTHBUSTERS

The NCA Myth Buster program was developed to train and equip a grassroots group of cattle-industry leaders

to be spokespeople so that the industry could collectively set its own agenda relative to key issues.

More than 200 trained volunteers have been very successful in sending positive cattle-industry messages to local and state audiences that NCA and other industry organizations alone cannot reach.

To date, nearly half of the states have either committed to the program or expressed interest in pursuing it.

NCA INDUSTRY TOURS

NCA has been active conducting beef industry tours for restaurant executives, food-service editors and retail food executives.

June tour guests were shown that steps are being taken in all segments of the beef business to produce and market safe, wholesome, desirable beef products more efficiently.

September tour guests toured Colorado State University, Con-Agra/Monfort Inc., Farr Feeders Inc., Aristocrat Brangus Ranch and Meining Cattle Company.

These tours have proven to be beneficial in developing a positive image of the beef industry sensitive to the prevailing issues of society.

Ultimately, the beef-industry tours will help establish an upward trend in favorable attitudes among retailers, restaurateurs, purveyors and educators relative to the public issues affecting the cattle and beef industry.
