FOUNDATION FACTS

ADOPT-A-McDONALD'S: RIFKIN LAYS AN EGG

Hear that? It's the sound of laughter—laughter from the national media directed at Jeremy Rifkin's Adopt-A-McDonald's campaign. Pre-event hype published by the Beyond Beef campaign promised 20,000 protestors at 3,000 McDonald's in 900 cities on April 17. In Chicago alone, campaign organizers promised 250 restaurants would be picketed. The protestors were supposed to urge McDonald's to include a Veggie burger on its menu. But it didn't happen. In the end, only 11 Windy City outlets were picketed. Elsewhere in the nation, there were relatively few picketers and those who arrived stayed only a short time. For most part, events were peaceful and media interest was lacking or negative toward Rifkin. One New York reporter characterized the campaign as "a souffle without the egg whites—flat as a pancake." One of the nation's leading columnists, Mike Royko of the *Chicago Tribune*, ridiculed Rifkin and the veggie burger concept in two consecutive columns. (See related story.) To make sure that any media coverage that Rifkin did get was balanced and accurate, cattle business representatives were out in force across the country April 17. Representatives from state cattlemen's associations and state beef councils were on hand at the local level armed with media kits prepared by the Food Facts Coalition, which includes NCA and the Beef Industry Council. Third-part experts and industry spokespersons were on hand through satellite hook-ups to answer questions.

NCA TESTIFIES AT CLEAN WATER HEARING

"No other federal statute potentially could have such pervasive impact on land and water use fundamental to agriculture," NCA Private Lands and Environmental Management Committee Chairman Paul Genho of Saint Cloud, Florida, told a House Public Works subcommittee that NCA believes states should retain primary authority with regard to water quality standards and water allocation. Feedlots affected by CWA point-source regulations should be provided more flexibility in controlling discharges, he said. Genho cautioned the subcommittee to carefully review Environmental Protection Agency data that implicates agriculture as a major non-point source pollution contributor because the EPA data is incomplete. He outlined NCA's Water Quality Information Project through which NCA is collecting information to determine exactly where there are non-point source water pollution problems associated with cattle production and how they can be solved.

WHATS FOR DINNER? IT'S ACTIVIST LITE

Excerpt from Chicago Tribune columnist Mike Royko's nationally syndicated column, April 20.

"If people like Jeremy Rifkin had a sense of honor, they would apologize to McDonald's and America's hamburger lovers for being a public nuisance. Then they would go off to some remote part of India and seek sainthood by washing feet in a leper colony.

"But being a compulsive busybody, Rifkin can't leave it alone.

He and his beef-hating followers are nagging McDonald's. They are picketing franchises and having a fine time demanding the McDonald's add a "veggie burger" to the menu.

"If Rifkin were something other than an intellectual gnat, he would boldly form a corporation, invest his own money, persuade his fellow beef-haters to put their savings in his stock.

"They could open a chain of fast-food restaurants selling veggie burgers, tofu burgers, seaweed burgers, cabbage burgers and other healthful delicacies. They could call it the Twitburger.

"That would be putting their money where their sensitive taste buds are. But they won't because they know it would be scorned. America does not want a Twitburger. It prefers something it can really chomp on. Damn the cholesterol, full speed ahead."

BEEF "ON" FORGE BEEFMASTER BULL TEST

Dear Cattlemen:

Consignors and sponsors of the Seventh Annual Beef "ON" Forage, Beefmaster Bull Test, will be hosting a Field Day, Saturday, June 5th, 9:00 a.m. at the Bull Test Facility, Lexington, Texas. The 154 bulls are consigned by 24 members of the Central Texas Beefmaster Breeders (Satellite of the Foundation Beefmaster Association), and are being forage tested under the guidelines of the Texas Forage and Grassland Council Forage Bull Development Program.

The purpose of the test is to identify those bulls having a superior genetic ability to convert forages to beef by comparing contemporaries within an age and breed group in a uniform grazing environment. The 300 day development program will consist of winter phase and summer phase with bull's weights being taken every 28 days during the development period.

Currently the bulls average 16 months of age and are within 90 days of age. These bulls will have completed the 140 day winter phase of the forage test and all performance information are available. An October 16, 1993 Sale at Brenham, Texas is planned and each bull will sell with complete performance evaluation to include: adjusted 205 w.w., yearling weights, gain weights, weight per day of age, ratios, rib-eye measurements and scrotal circumference.

Join us June 5, for an informative day which includes speakers, refreshments, lunch, pasture tours, door prizes (2 - \$500 Certificates), sponsor products and displays and inspection of the 154 Beefmaster Bulls.
