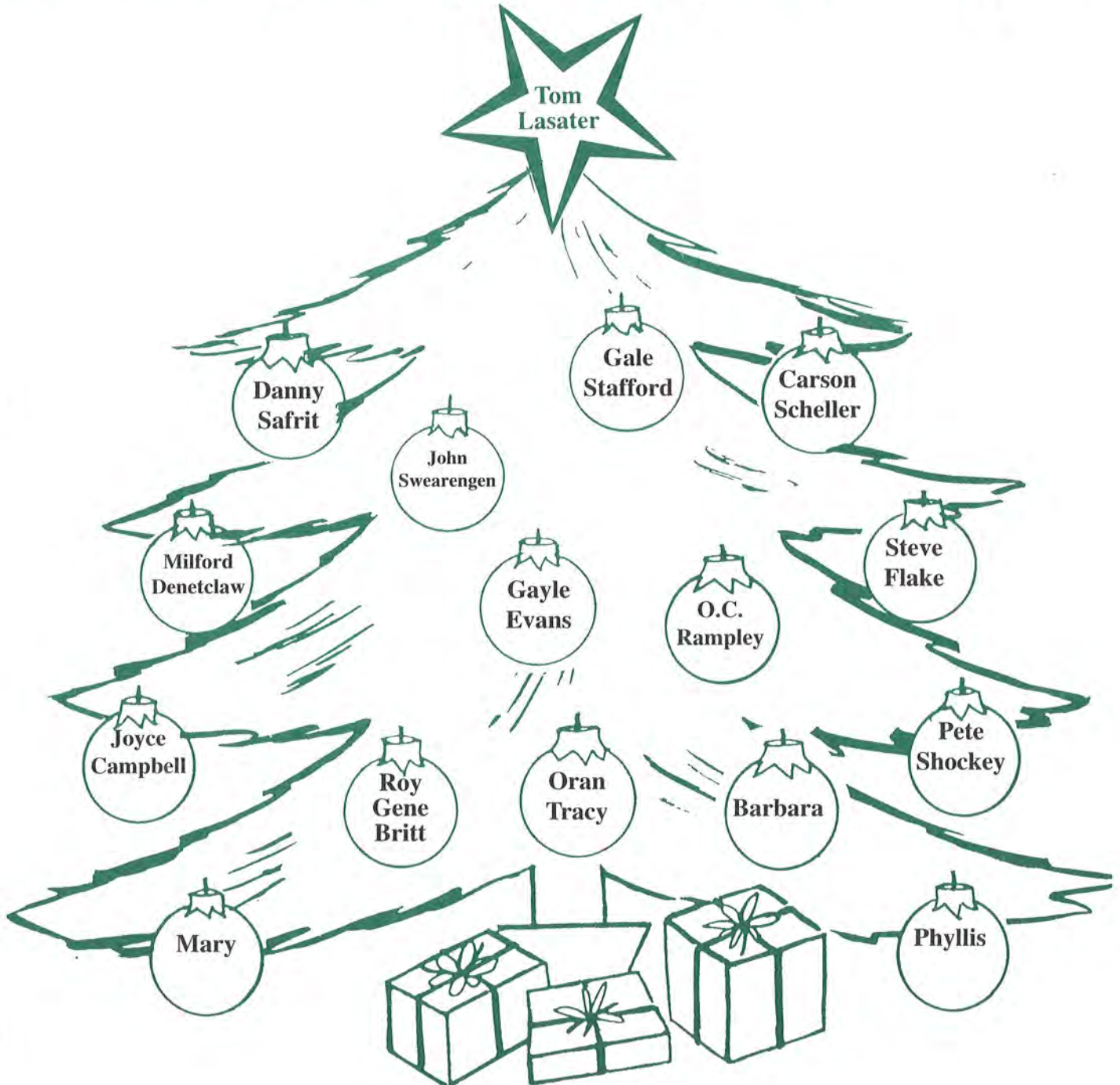

## Director's Message

I would take this occasion to express appreciation to our staff and the Heart of America folks for the exceptional convention this year.

Several decisions were made that we all need to support. The cost of certifying was changed a bit in order to better suit the different types of operations. Beginning January 1, 1995 the cost of certificates will be ..... Birth to 12 months \$10.00, 12 to 18 months \$15.00, 18 months to 24 months \$35.00 and everything over 2 years \$100.00. The grandfather clause instituted several years ago will remain. All cattle born prior to 12/31/90 can be certified at \$35.00.

There was a shortfall this past year making it necessary to withdraw 30 thousand from our reserve. Seems all costs continue to rise and there was a marked decline in the number of cattle certified. I can't express how important it is for all of us to certify our cattle. With the change in the fee's I think no matter how you figure, the sooner you certify the less expensive it is even if you end up discarding 25% of the certificates.

The other item I would like to address is the acquiring of a computer for our office. Our staff has done a tremendous job of getting by without when most of us have a PC in our home. As you know computers are rather expensive and require continual up-dating and adding to on regular occasions. With the move toward more record keeping, that might involve the office keeping records for individual breeders, this was a necessary move probably past due.

Many of us are guilty of trying to beat-the-rap when it comes to association expenses, let's repent and try to do better so that the cost of Association operations can be spread more evenly.

## PRESS RELEASE

### Foundation Beefmaster Associations 23rd Annual Convention One of the Best Ever

Despite a steady rain that began on Wednesday and continued without noticeable letup through the ranch tours on Saturday, the 23rd Annual Convention of the Foundation Beefmaster Association was one of the best attended in recent years. From the standpoint of work accomplished it was also one of the best. The convention was held at the Holiday Inn University Plaza in Springfield, Missouri, November 3rd through the 5th, 1994.

According to Mary Wilkinson, Executive Secretary of FBA, "This year's convention, dubbed the "Show Me" convention by the folks from Missouri, lived up to its "Show Me" billing. Mary said it would take a while to check the records, but she felt this convention may have had more FBA members registered than any in the past. She continued, "We were all very gratified by the large turnout. At least to some degree, this turnout reflects the rapidly rising interest in the Beefmaster breed. We think our breed is on the absolute leading edge of the cattle industries future, and the interest generated at this convention confirms that belief.

The convention got underway Thursday morning, November 3 with working committee meetings and a final board meeting. Introduction of those running for election to the Board of Directors took place Thursday evening during The President's Reception. Those attending enjoyed a wonderful buffet, dancing and entertainment that featured real Missouri Clog dancers.

The general membership meeting, election of officers, and new board meeting all took place on Friday, November 4th.

The associations Executive Secretary, Mary Wilkinson, gave her report to the members. Mary, who traveled to all of the satellite events throughout the year reported that she sensed greater excitement from virtually all of the FBA people she met. She also said that this last year has been very busy with requests for services from many FBA members. She concluded her report by thanking Phyllis Sherriff and the rest of her staff for their assistance during

the past year.

The featured speaker for this year's convention was Mr. Charles Kruse. Mr. Kruse, President of the Missouri Farm Bureau, delivered his keynote address at the luncheon during the general membership meeting.

His talk warned of the encroaching role of the federal government into the daily lives of ranchers and farmers. Mr. Kruse pointed out that these day folks in agriculture have to deal not only with the government but also with activist groups. On several occasions he used humor to clearly emphasize his point. As an example, he was speaking about a press corp. that often publicizes the view point of certain activists groups, without ever understanding anything about agriculture. In his example, a reporter from a major metropolitan newspaper asked why the cow in the adjoining pasture didn't have any horns. Mr. Kruse explained to the reporter that sometimes cows didn't have horns because they had been bred that way. Other times cows didn't have horns because they had been de-horned, but on this occasion, the cow the reporter alluded to didn't have horns because that particular cow ... was a horse.

Without question, Mr. Kruse was one of FBA's most popular speakers.

Following lunch the election of new members to Board of Directors was held. Seven people were running to fill four positions. Leading the board were Barbara Truitt of Truitt Beefmasters in Sheldon, Missouri; Shelby Phillips of Phillips Beefmasters in Deming, New Mexico; President of the association, Gerry Holmes, of Hillview Beefmasters in Falkville, Alabama, and Bob Boswell of Boswell Beefmasters in Gorman, Texas.

The new members elected to the board are O. C. Rampley of Rampley Beefmasters in Silverton, Texas; Roy Gene Britt of Britt Beefmasters in Okolona, Arkansas; John Swearengen of Spade Beefmasters in Universal City, Texas and Pete Shockey of Shockey Beefmasters in Alamo, New Mexico.

Following the general membership meeting, the new board held their first meeting and elected officers for the coming year. Steve Flake of F Bar Cattle Company, Snowflake Beefmasters in Snowflake, Arizona was elected President, Oran Tracy of T.O. Beefmasters in Virgil, Kansas, Vice President; Roy Gene Britt of Britt Beefmasters in Okolona, Arkansas, Secretary; and Gayle Evans of Evans Beefmasters in Enterprise, Utah, Treasurer.

## Eighth Annual Beef "ON" Forage Beefmaster Bull Sale

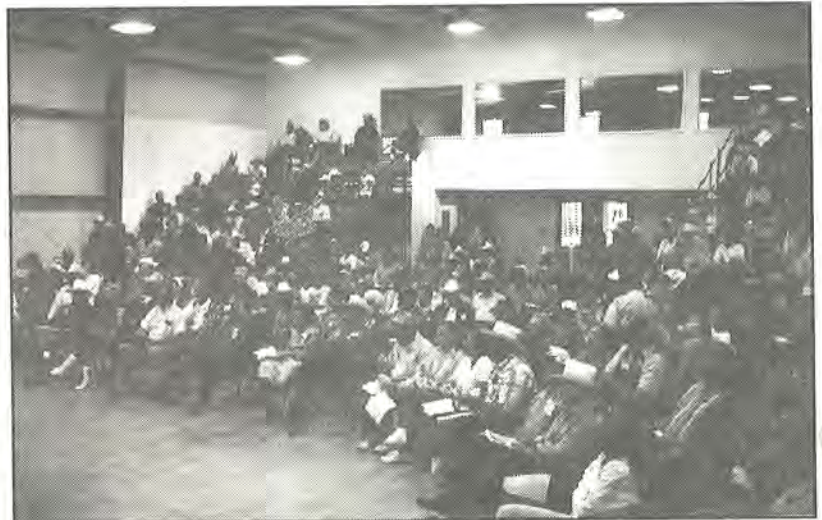
The Central Texas Beefmaster Breeders held the Eighth Annual Beef "ON" Forage Beefmaster Bull Sale, Saturday October 15, in Brenham, Texas. Twenty Eight consignors sold 110 two year old performance tested, forage developed bulls and 20 bred heifers. Buyers from 5 states paid a total of \$199,700 to average \$1,815.45 for the bulls and \$26,200 to average \$1,310 for the heifers.

High selling bull was Lot #13 a Buckmaster Beefmaster, Holland, Texas consignment which sold to O.C. Rampley, Rampley Beefmasters, Silvertown, Texas for \$6,000. Second high selling bull, Lot #31 was a Frenzel Beefmaster consignment selling for \$5,800 to Alan Lanik of Rocky Creek Beefmasters, Yorktown, Texas. Boswell Beefmaster, Gorman Texas consigned the third high selling bull, Lot # 1 which sold to Bill Ross, Micah Ross Beefmasters of Berryville, Arkansas for \$5,000. Volume bull buyer was Robert Norsworthy of Navasota, Texas who purchased 12 bulls.

High selling heifer was a Frenzel Beefmaster consignment selling to Harry Goodwin, Goodwin Beefmasters, Eddy, Texas for \$2,000. Boswell Beefmasters consigned the second high selling heifer which sold to Ruth Long, Long L F Beefmasters of Decatur, Texas for \$1,800. Marek

Beefmaster consigned the third high selling heifer which sold for \$1,700 to B.J. Travis of Vidor, Texas.
