PRESS RELEASE

At our 34th bull sale on October 7th we sold 229 bulls to 8 states and Mexico for an average of \$1436.00. Of the forty buyers, twenty-five were repeat customers, including two second generation customers. We appreciate both the old and new buyers.

We sold four loads of preconditioned Beefmaster Calves on the Superior Video sale November 11th. A customer, A.T. McCullough, sold one load of steers. Attached is a report.

Steers weighing 400-425 brought \$65.00 - \$71.00 with the Beefmasters bringing \$71.00. Steers weighing 550-640 brought \$56.50 - \$65.35 with the beefmasters bringing \$64.35. Heifers weighing 500-540 brought \$49.00 - \$75.50 with the Beefmasters bringing \$75.50. There is a lot of misinformation floating around about how different breeds sell. That is how they sold 11/11/95 in an offering of 22,000 cattle from all over the U.S. and Mexico.

Also attached is closeout information on Joe Dan Wedgeworth's steers fed through NewBeef. Joe Dan is buying top bulls here and taking advantage of the marketing assistance we offer our customers.

We have for sale the following highly desirable females:

- 226 1991 First Cross Beefmaster cows calving February 10th (5 loads will sell 1 load or more). Proven cows-mothers of some of the calves we sold on the video.
- 42 Registered Beefmaster cows and heifers calving February 10th (1 load or will sell cows or heifers). Bred to the very best bulls.
- 180 Registered Beefmaster open yearling heifers-ready to breed. Ready to breed A.I. or to your best herd bulls. Will sell all or part.

Beefmaster Breeders United is now a reality. Beefmasters are fifth in annual registrations nationally and looking forward to moving up rapidly.



SATELLITE NEWS

Unification Approved: By now, you are probably aware that the much-talked about unification has become a reality. Voting at the convention was 86.2 per cent in favor of the consolidation. (BBU approved the unification at their convention in October with only 5 dissenting votes out of over 600 ballots cast). There is much enthusiasm for moving forward in Beefmaster Breeders United. BBU President Don Biles described the union as "synergistic"; i.e., the total is greater than the sum of the parts. We can accomplish more than we could acting separately, enjoying greater marketing opportunities while still retaining the principles we prize and the identification with the Lasater philosophy we believe in.

CTBB President Don Fields comments as follows:

"Members of FBA voted 180 to 28 (86.2%) in favor of unification with BBU, with the unified association to be known as "Beefmaster Breeders United". A letter will be coming to you from the BBU office in San Antonio explaining how to join, the cost etc. This should not be much different from the way we have been doing things in the past. You must make application for membership; however, wait for the BBU letter.

"Now, some things to do immediately with the FBA office in Denver:

1. Certify all cattle (probably mostly cows) that do not have FBA certificates. In the future, calves out of non-certified cows cannot be certified. The cost is \$6 for all cattle over 18 months of age and \$15 for cattle between 12 and 18 months of age.
2. Certify all of your eligible 1995 calves. The cost is \$10 (same fee as always).
3. If you are in an upgrading program, certify your 1st and 2nd crosses. They will not be inspected by BBU, but their offspring will be inspected (this is association policy) before they can be certified. The cost is \$4 for cattle over 18 months of age; \$15 for cattle between 12 and 18 months old, and \$10 for cattle younger than 12 months.

"These things must be done before December 31, 1995. The Denver office will not accept any papers after that date. After you have made application and joined BBU, you must send your FBA certificates of breeding (duly registered with FBA before December 31, 1995) to BBU and exchange them for new certificates. There will be no charge for the exchange. You will have two years (January 1, 1996-December 31, 1997) to make the exchange. This may seem a long and difficult procedure, but it can be fairly easily done if we put our minds to it. We urge you to not delay with your paperwork. The Denver office already has a backlog so do it NOW. Again, the Denver office will close December 31, 1995. Your CTBB directors will try to answer any questions you may have regarding these procedures.

"Our cattle are important to us. Most of us have worked long and hard to achieve what we have today. Believe me, others are interested too, so don't lose what you have. Just roll up your sleeves today and get it done. I wish that all of you could have been in Sacramento and heard the BBU President Don Biles, former President Charles Landrum and Executive Vice President Wendell Shronk speak. These are down to earth, practical cattlemen committed to making this unification work. We were impressed and came away with a sense of well being for all CTBB and FBA members. We (and I stress WE) can make it work and it is a Must - Be situation in regard to our cattle."

FBA Convention in Sacramento: CTBB was well represented at the convention by the Campbells, Swearengens, Rampleys, Hicks, Staffords, Terry Frenzels, Ranleys, Don fields and us Boswells. We were pleased to have Don Fields elected as Director. The significance of this position is that the FBA Board of Directors will serve on committees in the new Beefmaster Breeders United. Other FBA Directors chosen were Ward Burroughs, Ron Freeman and Gerry Holmes.

Looking to the Future: What will become of CTBB? This question was on everybody's mind. CTBB will continue; in all likelihood, we will become a marketing group with directors, dues and the deep comraderie we have had for so many years. As a marketing group, we would enjoy considerable self-regulation while offering those members who want them access to BBU programs. These questions will be addressed at our annual meeting in Kerrville on March 2, 1996. Wendell Shronk will be our featured speaker, and I guarantee he will inspire you!

Beef "On" Forage will certainly go on. Gary and Clifton are readying the 1996 program as you read this. Delivery of the test bulls will take place December 16.

At Sacramento, Mr. Shronk spoke about the need for hard facts to prove the value of Beefmaster cattle in the feedlot and meat case. We often feel that our cattle are unfairly discounted at sale time. Beefmasters lack the ready identification that

Angus and Herefords enjoy because of their color, but Beefmaster breeders aren't going to cull good animals because their hides don't match some chart. We need to do some large scale feeding trials and get results on the rail that will back up our claims. As Satchel Paige said, "It ain't bragging if you can prove it!" BBU is interested in assisting small breeders in commingling feeder cattle to allow them an opportunity to demonstrate what Beefmasters can do, much as Laurie Lasater's NewBeef and the Ranch to Rail program have done for Texas cattlemen. CTBB may be interested in focusing efforts in this direction.

Lasater Ranch Sale: Caro and I attended the Lasater Bull and Cow contract sale September 12 and 13, as always, it is uplifting to visit the Lasater Ranch and see the foundation herd and to visit with FBA friends from around the country. Some good Lasater genetics went home with a number of CTBB members including Gale Stafford, Walt and Joyce Campbell, James and Bessie Garner, Kent and Pam Mindemann, Ron and Glen Morgan. Gary Frenzel and I left with Esperanza bulls from Dale Lasater's herd. In the annual auction of retired Lasater herd sires, Salt Creek Beefmasters purchased the high selling bull, after some spirited bidding

Wendell Shronk, Nolan Ryan and Charles Landrum of BBU were present at the herd sire auction, and Shronk and Landrum gave an overview of unification meetings and highlights of the talks where differences were ironed out. FBA representatives Gayle Evans and Gale Stafford spoke to the group from the FBA standpoint. All of their comments were very positive and the group responded affirmatively.

Beef On Forage Sale: This year's sale saw the average dip for the first time in the history of Beef "on" Forage. Ninety-five bulls averaged \$1,516.32. This was down by \$300 from last year's record average, although the quality of the animals was the best ever, due to the heavy culling and the steady improvement in the kind of bulls offered,

The lower prices should come as a surprise to no one, considering the current state of the cattle market. Let's just assume that those happy buyers who took home bargains this year will be so pleased with the bulls' performance that they'll be back for more next year, and ready to pay what they're worth!

The Friday evening get-together was enjoyable, with a number of buyers coming for an early look at the bulls. We owe special thanks to Gary and Clifton for their efforts throughout the year on behalf of the forage test program. CTBB is lucky to have ment of their caliber dedicated to th program. Without them it would never have become the outstanding event it is today.

Gary Frenzel had the high selling bull, which went to Nolan Ryan (Derek was in favor of their just keeping the check as a souvenir!). Second and third high selling bulls were also from the Frenzel herd. Twelve heifers averaged \$991.67; the two high selling heifers were consigned by Spade Beefmasters and purchased by Wayne Buckmaster for \$1,600 each.

Co-Op Advertising refunds: You were advised by Mary Wilkinson last March of the amount of reimbursement you can claim for advertising you have done, featuring the FBA logo. The monies not claimed by CTBB members by December 31, 1995, will be returned to CTBB for promotional efforts. We urge you to act quickly if you plan to apply for reimbursement, because of the heavy workload in the Denver office. If you do no claim your refund and if we do not hear from you, we will assume you have no objection to your share of the funds being turned over to CTBB.

It was good to visit with CTBB's newest member, Bryan Byrd, at the Beef Forage sale. Pleas add his name to your year-book.

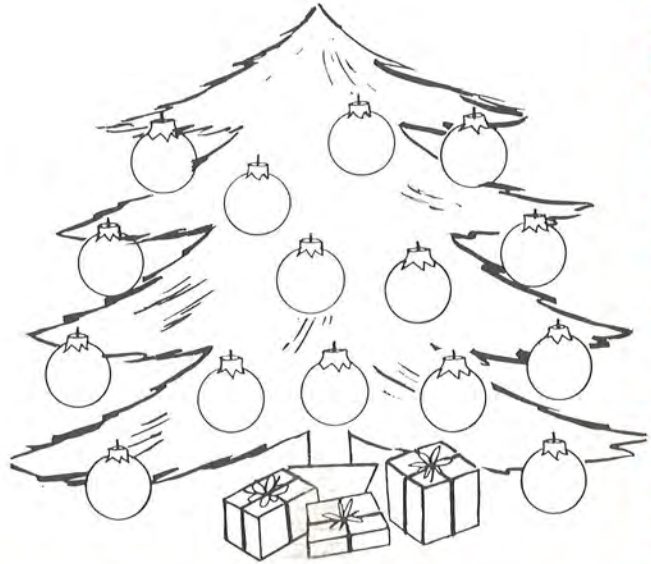
